4 Key Points of 1 Corinthians

- There is only one body and one Christ
- How Church discipline is to be done
- Spiritual Gifts are to edify one another
- Love is complete

Chapter	Summarization
1 Corinthians 1	Paul begins with giving thanks to God for the many gifts this church has received and then writes about the problem of elevating human leaders and the exaltation of human wisdom. His desire is to see unity in the church.
1 Corinthians 2	Paul writes about his founding of the church in Corinth and reminds the Corinthian believers about the cross and to have reliance on the Spirit.
1 Corinthians 3	Paul rebukes them for elevating the teachers of the God's Word over the Word itself.
1 Corinthians 4	Paul writes about how being a faithful steward and all that it entails including being trusted by the master. He tells them that he is sending Timothy.
1 Corinthians 5	Paul writes about the Need, reason and extent for church discipline.
1 Corinthians 6	Paul rebukes them for taking fellow believers to court before non-believing judges over petty matters and warns them to control their bodies.
1 Corinthians 7	Paul talks about marriage and who should and shouldn't marry.
1 Corinthians 8	Paul writes about Christian liberty and if believers should eat food offered to pagan gods.

1 Corinthians 9	Paul talks about how he is a good model for believers and his apostleship and then talks about winning the good race.
1 Corinthians 10	The blessings and fall of Israel and the faithfulness and fellowship of God.
1 Corinthians 11	How we are to act in church service and communion.
1 Corinthians 12	Paul talks about the source and use of spiritual gifts
1 Corinthians 13	Paul Talks about the importance, perfection of love and that it is complete.
1 Corinthians 14	Paul writes about the gifts of tongues, the rules and use of tongues and the contrast it to the gift of prophecy.
1 Corinthians 15	Paul discusses the resurrection and the protest against the resurrection of Christ. He then looks at the resurrection of believers and their perfection.
1 Corinthians 16	Paul finishes with instructions about giving an offering for the Christians in Jerusalem. He passes along greetings from several other people and ends with a call to love, cursing of all those against God and the return of Christ.
