4 Key Points of 2 Corinthians

Chapter	Summarization
2 Corinthians 1	Paul opens with consolation in the face of suffering and his recent trips to Asia.
2 Corinthians 2	Paul writes about his last letters, forgiveness, Titus, how the gospel is effected those who hear.
2 Corinthians 3	Paul talks about God's grace, that he does not need to carry letters of recommendation, God's revealed glory and the New Covenant of grace and humanity.
2 Corinthians 4	Paul writes about how to handle scripture and how to deal with suffering.
2 Corinthians 5	All believers will receive new bodies and about our duty as ambassadors for Christ.
2 Corinthians 6	Paul had many hardships that he had endured. He warns against being un equally yoked/married with unbelievers.
2 Corinthians 7	Paul expresses his joy and relief over the Corinthian church's repentance that has been reaffirmed by Titus.

2 Corinthians 8 Paul writes to the Corinthian church about sacrificial giving for the destitute believers in Jerusalem.

2 Corinthians 9 He continues writing about giving, the principle of giving and the rewards of giving. He closes in reminding us that God gave his son.

2 Corinthians 10 Paul defends his apostleship against the Judaizers by talking about his meekness, his authority in Christ and his desire for them to grow.

2 Corinthians 11 Paul continues to warn against false apostles. He then goes into his suffering for the gospel.

2 Corinthians 12 Paul describes his vision of being “caught up into the third heaven.” He also discusses the thorn in the flesh to keep him humble. He writes about some of his concerns for when he visit them.

2 Corinthians 13 Paul talks more about when he comes to visit and closes the letter.
