5 Key Points of Matthew

- Jesus is a descendant of King David and the climax of the messianic
- Jesus is Baptized and tested in the Desert
- Jesus gives the Sermon on the Mount
- Jesus gives many parables to his disciples and other followers
- Jesus dies on the cross and is resurrected 3 days later

Chapter	Summarization
Matthew 1	Jesus' genealogy is given, Mary is introduced as a virgin who miraculously conceives, and Joseph is her fiancé that receives a visit from an angel.
Matthew 2	Joseph and Mary are married and Mary gives birth to Jesus. The magi come to see Jesus and Herod tries to have him killed. Joseph and Mary escape to Egypt and return after Herod dies.
Matthew 3	The ministry of John the Baptist begins. John baptizes Jesus and then the Holy Spirit comes down on Jesus as God proclaims that he is well pleased with his Son.
Matthew 4	Jesus is led by the Holy Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the Devil. After this Jesus returns to start his ministry and gather followers.
Matthew 5	Jesus begins the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus teaches about the meek, merciful, pure and righteous.
Matthew 6	Jesus continues the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus teaches about giving, prayer, fasting, treasures and trusting.
Matthew 7	Jesus concludes the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus teaches about asking God

for what we need, how we should treat others, and how to live as child of God.

Matthew 8 Jesus heals many people. This includes a leper, A centurion's servant, Peter's mother-in-law and demon-possessed people. Jesus takes a boat across the Sea of Galilee and calms a storm to the amazement of the disciples. He then talks about being a follower of him.

Matthew 9 Jesus carries on his ministry of healing people including a paralytic, a sick woman, two blind men and sick people throughout Galilee. He then meets with a tax collector named Matthew and some of the disciples of John the Baptist.

Matthew 10 Jesus gives instructions the disciples with him, the disciples who will live through the time of the Great Tribulation and the disciples who live today.

Matthew 11 Jesus reassures John the Baptist, rebukes the cities of Korazin, Bethsaida and Capernaum. He praises God and reveals that he is the only way to the Father.

Matthew 12 Jesus confronts the Pharisees and heals a demon-possessed, blind and mute man. Jesus heals many and fulfills the prophecies of Isaiah 42:1–4. He teaches that all who obey his Father in heaven is part of his family!

Matthew 13 Jesus teaches about the Kingdom of Heaven using parables about the sower and the seed, the wheat and the thistle, the mustard seed, the yeast, the treasure in the field, the merchant and the pearl, the sorting of fish and the homeowner and his treasure.

Matthew 14 Herod Antipas beheads John the Baptist. Jesus miraculously feeds the 5,000 and walks on water.

Matthew 15 Jesus confronts the Pharisees about their corruption. He then teaches a crowd of people and explains his teachings to Peter and the other disciples. Jesus heals a Canaanite woman's daughter, the lame, blind, crippled, and the mute. He then feeds the 4,000.

Matthew 16 The Pharisees demand that Jesus give a sign to prove his identity and he refuses. He warns his disciples to be cautious of the false teachings of these men. Jesus asks who people say he is and Peter says that Jesus is the Messiah.

Matthew 17 Jesus is transfiguring on the mountaintop with Moses and Elijah. He then

heals a demon-possessed boy and instructs Peter to pay the Temple tax with a coin he will find in the mouth of a fish. Jesus then predicts his own death.

Matthew 18 Jesus talks about who is great, how to escape hell, church discipline, and forgiving a sinful brother through the parable of the servant, master and king..

Matthew 19 Jesus confronts the Pharisees about divorce. He then teaches the disciples that all must be childlike in order to enter the Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus also talks about earthly riches and spiritual rewards.

Matthew 20 Jesus give the parable of the vineyard workers. He also proclaims his coming death. Jesus rejects the request by the mother of James and John asks Jesus to allow her sons to sit on his right and left side in the heaven. Jesus heals two blind men.

Matthew 21 On a donkey Jesus enters triumphantly into Jerusalem. He then drives the corrupt merchants out of the Temple. Jesus heals the blind and the lame at the temple and confronts the Pharisees. He then curses a fig tree and tells the parable of the two sons and the evil farmers.

Matthew 22 Jesus uses the illustration of the wedding to teach about the Kingdom of Heaven. He also avoids four verbal traps about paying taxes to Caesar, marriage and the resurrection, the greatest commandment and the Son of David set for him by the Pharisees and Sadducees.

Matthew 23 Jesus condemns the Pharisees that their evil ways will lead to seven judgments and he weeps over the loss of Jerusalem.

Matthew 24 Jesus begins the Olivet Discourse and predicts the destruction of the temple and the time of tribulation.

Matthew 25 Jesus concludes the Olivet Discourse Jesus uses the parable of the Ten Virgins and Talents. He then uses a parable about Sheep and Goats to illustrate the final judgment of unbelievers.

Matthew 26 In the upper room Jesus and disciples celebrate Passover and predicts Judas's betrayal and Peter's denial. Jesus then goes to Gethsemane to pray as is subsequently arrested and taken illegally before the high priest.

Matthew 27 Judas, feeling very guilty for betraying Jesus, hangs himself. Jesus is brought before Pilate who gives into the demands of the crowd and sentences Jesus to death by crucifixion. Later, Jesus died on the cross giving up his life to

save man from their sin.

Matthew 28

Jesus is resurrected and then appears to Mary and Mary Magdalene and then to the eleven disciples giving them the great commission.
