5 Key Points of Romans

- People are justified by faith and not outwardly actions
- Sin came through Adam
- Sanctification is through the cross
- This gift was rejected by the Jews and accepted by the Gentiles
- Salvation cannot be lost

Chapter	Summarization
Romans 1	Paul talks to the Roman church about his credentials, that the Messiah was prophesied in the Old Testament and a saving faith for sinners.
Romans 2	Paul describes God's dealings with the moral person, pagans and religious people.
Romans 3	What are the advantages of being a circumcised Jew, was God's promises nullified, should God out of his righteousness punish us for our unrighteousness, are the Jews better, how God saves people and will the law be nullified by faith.
Romans 4	Abraham and King David are used to explain the doctrine of justification by faith.
Romans 5	Paul writes about the joy of faith and the difference between the sinful Adam and the sinlessness of Christ.
Romans 6	God's method of leading to sanctification is through being crucified with Christ, to count our crucifixion and resurrection as finished, yield to God.
Romans 7	How the law of God affects spiritual people, natural people and carnal

	people.
Romans 8	All believer are to be assured that the receive no condemnation and are freed from sin and death, are blessed Holy Spirit, are adopted into God's family, have a new hope, have a prayer helper and a new destiny
Romans 9	Ishmael, Isaac, Esau, Jacob and Pharaoh are all part of the sovereignty of God. God choose Israel in the past but Hosea predicted that God would not limit his saving grace to Israel.
Romans 10	Paul writes about God's righteousness and how Israel has rejected his plan for salvation.
Romans 11	Paul discusses the majority of Jews who have rejected the messiah, the minority of Jews who have received him, the gentiles who are accepting Him and that God is not done with the Jews.
Romans 12	We are to make our bodies a living sacrifices to the glory of God.
Romans 13	We are to submit to the authority of the Government and that Jesus will be returning.
Romans 14	Believers should not be judged by other believers, all believers Will be judged by the savior, and all will confess Him as Lord.
Romans 15	Paul writes about our relationships with one another, his prayer for the church, his traveling plans and that he will be accepted in Jerusalem.
Romans 16	Paul says hello to some friends, warns of some trouble makers in the church and closes with the promises of the Gospel, mainly that Jesus is going to crush Satan.
